

DAY SEVEN - I am chosen, appointed to be fruitful...by Jesus.

John 15:16 "You did not *choose* Me, but I **chose** you and appointed you that you should go and bear fruit, and that your fruit should remain, that whatever you ask the Father in My name He may give you."
